Scheme of Work

Introduction

In this unit pupils take inspiration from the musical devices used in Vivaldi's 'The Four Seasons, Winter', to explore how contrasts in music can be used to create programmatic soundscapes. Throughout this unit the pupils will work in groups to create their own descriptive pieces of programmatic music. They will be given opportunities to use stave and graphic notation to record their music, as well as perform in front of others. They will also be given opportunities to appraise the performance of their peers as well as other recorded performances.

LESSON 5	To organise music using a ternary form structure.
