William Blake • William Blake was a poet and artist who lived from 1757 to 1827. • From early childhood, Blake had strange visions and claimed he saw angels. • Although he believed in God, Blake disliked organised religion and believed in the power and spirituality of the natural world. • He is considered to be a leading member of the Romantic movement. This was a literary and artistic phase which celebrated the power and beauty of nature. Romantics were opposed to increasing industrialisation and taking advantage of the poor.	Pneumatisation • Pneumatisation is the presence of air spaces within bones. • Mammals and humans have been found to have air spaces in bones, and some dinosaurs had them, too. • The presence of the air spaces in birds' bones means they can more easily fly.	Archaeopteryx • The archaeopteryx was a flying dinosaur which lived 150 million years ago. • It is believed to be one of the first ever birds. • It had sharp teeth, a bony tail and feathers. • The archaeopteryx could grow to up to half a metre long.
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
