
## Pop Art

Here are some more examples of Pop Art:






For this week's digital art task, you are going to create your own Pop Art.

You will need to use Paint for this week's art.

There is no right or wrong way to produce a piece of art, so we need to use a process called 'trial and error' to find the way that works best for you. Remember, that method may not be the same as your friend.

Try opening your picture in the program you want to use. Can you remember how to 'Copy and Paste' something you want more than one of? Have a play! Can you work out how to change the colours in your picture? Don't worry if it is not quite right, there is always the Undo button!





Here is a Pop Art picture made using a paint program. Like the work from the last lesson, the 'Fill' button has been used to change the background on each picture.

Don't worry if it's a bit messy! Pop Art wasn't always neat. You could use one of the other tools (like the paintbrush) to fill in the gaps.

Remember to use nice bright colours!

You could also use Word to make your Pop Art, but you might find this a bit trickier.





You can choose anything you like which inspires you to create your Pop Art.
