Our sound family this week is the

**ee** sound family.

There are lots of different ways of making the **ee** sound.

**ee** (sheep)

**ea** (meat)

**ey** (money)

**y** (happy)

**e-e** split digraph (even)

**i-e** (chief)

Today we are going to look at the **ee** and **ea** sounds. Can you see what Mickey Thompson and Purvis found on their hunt around the house?



### Activity 1 (segmenting for spelling).

These two sounds often sound the same in words but mean different things, e.g.

**m****ea****t**  and **m****ee****t**



These are called **homophones**.

Can you list some more homophones using the **ee** and **ea** sounds and draw some pictures to show what they mean?
