

## Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) Subject Policy

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1. Vision and values – inspiring hearts and minds

Our school vision is based on the writings of Paul to the Ephesians. This highlights three principles which form our decision making. We seek for all people in our school community to:

- Feel grounded and rooted in love
- To grow in breadth and depth of understanding
- To be filled with the fullness of life

Our school has adopted seven values and seven attributes which form the basis of the work we do, particularly in relation to our curriculum. It is these values and attributes that all of our subjects focus on instilling in our pupils.

Values: courage, compassion, thankfulness, forgiveness, wisdom, justice, truthfulness Attributes: knowledge, perseverance, collaboration, curiosity, comprehension, reasoning, creativity

The teaching of Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) is a liberation from insularity and provides an opening to other cultures, giving the children many opportunities to develop these values and attributes. At Abberley Parochial V.C. Primary School we have decided to teach French.

2. Intent

Through the teaching of MFL we seek to provide pupils with opportunities to make substantial progress in one language. It will provide opportunity for the children to experience both spoken and written language, laying foundations for further MFL teaching in KS3. The main focus in modern languages will be on practical communication, enabling pupils to communicate ideas, facts and feelings in speech and writing.

As a church school, we seek to enable pupils to gain a deep understanding of Christianity as a living world faith and how it links with the culture, tradition and values of other countries. Our MFL curriculum is closely linked to our whole school values developed through lessons, clubs, displays around the school and French mornings/afternoons.

Our intent in MFL is to inform and equip pupils.

3. Implementation (including timetable allocation)

French is taught in KS2 in line with the recommendations of the National Curriculum. Teaching staff take into account the individual needs and interests of the children. Each half-term has an allocated theme. Our French curriculum takes into account the different abilities, experiences and interests of the children whilst also developing an appreciation for the diversity, traditions and cultures which exist around the world.

French lessons take place in the classroom, around our school site and through whole school enrichment days. French is taught in a whole-class setting by the teacher. Teachers plan using the school's list of 'attributes', enabling children to be able to demonstrate these in lessons. Lessons are designed to motivate the children and there is a large focus on practical communication in LKS2 with added written

communication in UKS2. Children record their learning and written work informally in books which are passed on from year to year. This then becomes a portfolio of their learning.

Allocation

Year 3	30 minutes each week
Year 4	30 minutes each week
Year 5	30 minutes each week
Year 6	30 minutes each week

4. Impact (including monitoring of standards)

The subject leader monitors the effectiveness of the procedures implemented through the use of learning walks and book scrutiny. The MFL leader monitors planning and delivery on a termly basis and findings are shared with the SLT.

7. Assessment/inclusion and challenge

Children should receive clear feedback linked to their learning in their exercise books. Marking should be in line with the school's feedback policy. Children complete vocabulary quizzes for each module they are taught. Teaching assessments with reference to teacher observations, results from the vocabulary quizzes and work in books are made each term and discussed during pupil progress meetings.

8. Cross curricular and IT links

IT is used widely when teaching French to aid the teacher with pronunciation. Online games can be accessed by the children to embed their learning.

- 10. Staff development and expertise

Class teachers will teach French and have access to multiple documents/websites to support their teaching. MFL lead will be up to date with current legislation regarding the teaching of French and other languages within primary schools.

A subject review will take place annually informing the subject development plan which will then ensure that there has been sufficient curriculum coverage. MFL lead will take part in termly reviews of planning/progression through the use of learning walks.
