Can you think of some really unusual things that start with those letters?

Our sound family this week is the

ee sound family.

Today we are going to look at the **ey** and **y** the sounds.

Can you see what Mickey Thompson and Purvis found on their hunt around the house?





Remember the tough *y* rule. Both of these *ee* sounds usually come at the end of words.

It is difficult to know which one to use and something that just takes practise. However, you can look for some clues.

Adjectives (describing words) like funn*y*, sill*y*, happ*y* usually just have a *y*.

Some words have a pattern like

mon*ney*, jour*ney*, hon*ney*, chim*ney*.

key, don*key*, mon*key*, tur*key*, hoc*key*.
