Have a go at some of the tricky word activities below to practise your tricky words.

Blending for reading.

1. Ghost Game

This is a firm favourite in school. Write all your tricky words on equal sized pieces of paper and on 3 additional pieces of paper draw a picture of a ghost.



Put all the pieces of paper in a bag and take it in turns to pull one out. If you get a tricky word read it out loud. If you get the ghost shout BOO!

2. Jump the lily pads



This is just one of many great 'tricky' word games that you can play outside. Have hoops on the ground with 'tricky' words written in chalk inside them. Children find it quite good fun just jumping down the lily pads and saying the words. You can also throw things like beanbags into the hoops and try to say the word that you hit.

Segmenting for spelling.

1. Rainbow writing

Practise writing your tricky words in the 7 colours of the rainbow and create some lovely rainbow pictures.



2. Quick write

Ask your grown-up to read out your tricky words and see if you can write them down. Challenge yourself to see how many you can do in a minute. Don't forget your best handwriting and you must spell them correctly!
