Blending for reading.

1. Treasure hunt

A really good way to practise new tricky words is to write them on lots of pieces of paper and hide them around the house.

When your child finds one they need to read the word out loud and match it to the correct action word card.

2. Story spot

When reading books with your child, see how many tricky words they can spot.



## Segmenting for spelling.

### 1. Rainbow writing

### 2. Magnetic letters or bath letters

Try making your tricky words out of magnetic letters or bath letters or lettered building blocks if you have them.
