Today we are going to be thinking about **split digraphs**. We have already seen some of these when we have been looking at different sound families but they are tricky so they are worth revisiting.

There are 5 split digraphs.

a-e	(cake)
e-e	(even)
i-e	(bike)
o-e	(stone)
u-e	(tube)

Remember our song that reminds us of the long vowel sound the letters make.

Remember the  $\boldsymbol{\ell}$  is always on the end of the word and a letter will jump between the vowel and the


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Activity 1 (blending for reading).
